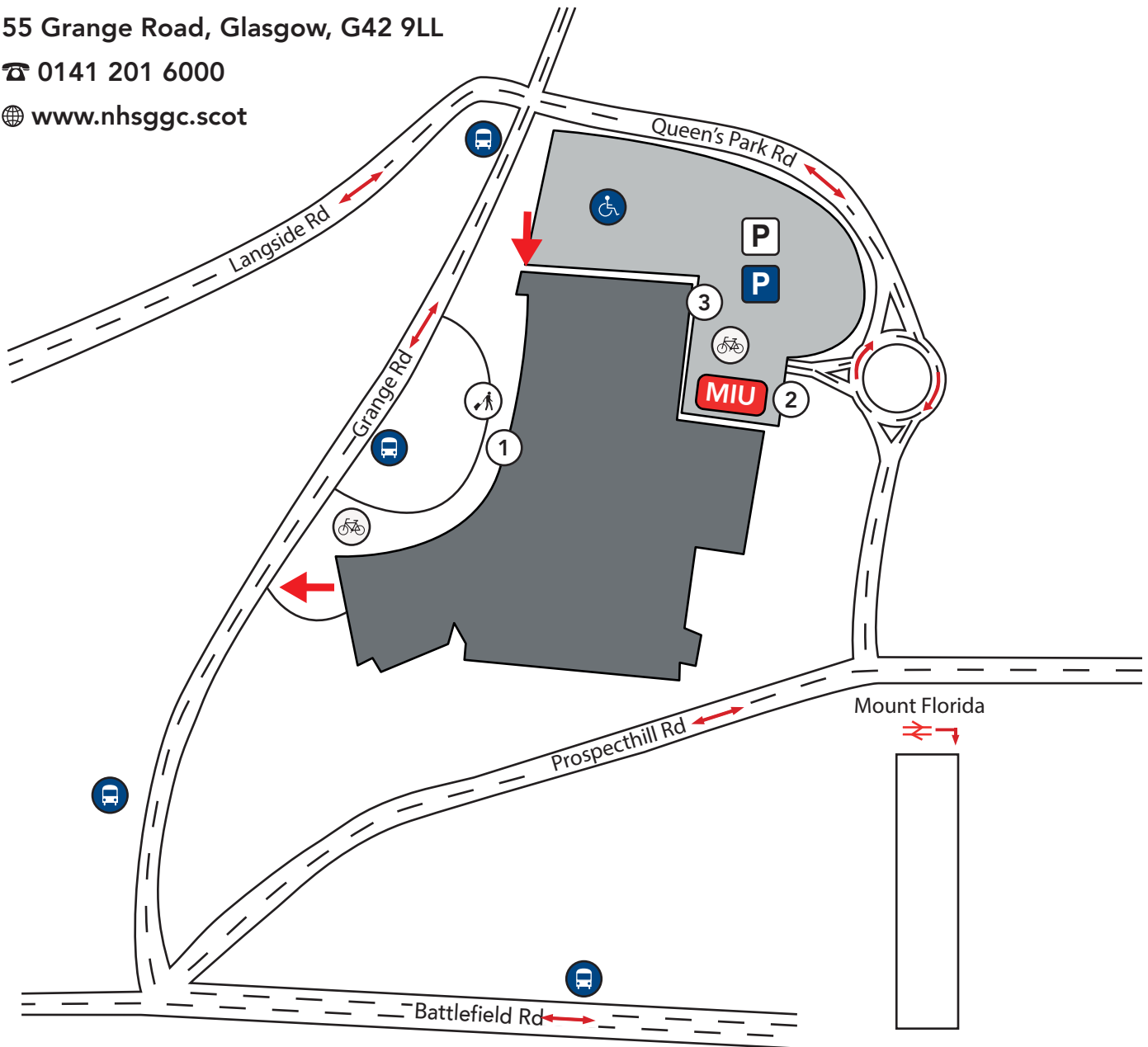

Directions to the Hospital

Walking and Cycling

There is a good network of pedestrian facilities connecting the hospital to nearby communities, including connections from public transport locations. The site also benefits from its close proximity to the South City Way cycle route. There are designated cycle parking areas located on the campus, at the main entrance, Minor Injuries and in the lower parking area. There is also a public bike hire station located nearby at the corner of Prospecthill Road and Battlefield Road.

By Bus

Buses that stop near the hospital:

By Train – Mount Florida Station

Mount Florida station is the nearest station to the hospital, with Queens Park and Crosshill stations also in close proximity. Mount Florida station is approximately 0.3 mile walk from the main entrance and has a lift to provide step free access from the platforms.

By Car

- **Clarkston and Cathcart** – Use Clarkston Road (B676). Continue along Holmlea Road. Turn left onto Battlefield Road. Continue straight through the traffic lights onto Grange Road. The hospital is on the right.

- **Rutherglen** – Use King’s Park Avenue (B762). Continue onto Kings Park Road. Straight through the traffic lights and turn left onto Battlefield Road. Then as above.
- **East Kilbride and Castlemilk** - Use Carmunnock Bypass (B766). Continue along Carmunnock Road, and then turn left for King’s Park Road. Straight through the traffic lights and turn left onto Battlefield Road. Then as above.
- **Newton Mearns and Giffnock** – Use Fenwick Road and Kilmarnock Road (A77), then at Shawlands Cross follow diversion signs into Minard Road. Then straight over for Langside Avenue. Continue onto Battlefield Road, turn left onto Grange Road. The hospital is on the right.
- **Pollok area** – use Mosspark Boulevard turning right into Dumbreck Road. Straight over Titwood Road. Turn Right for Minard Road. Straight over for Langside Avenue. Then as above.
- **Govan** – use Broomloan Road, Dumbreck Road and follow the direction as above. From South exit M77 at Junction 1. Turn right for Dumbreck Road and follow route as above.

Car Parking

There are drop off and pick up bays in the hospital grounds for main department entrances. Patient and visitor parking is available, but car parks and surrounding areas are often busy, so please consider other travel options such as the bus or train, if they are a suitable alternative. Car parking is free but there is a 4 hour maximum stay. Car Park attendants are available to provide advice if required.

Disabled Parking

Disabled spaces are available in both the underground and street level carparks. Please display your ‘Blue Badge’.
