

  - > Adult

  - > Learning Disability
  - >Mental Health
- Provides students with knowledge, skills and contemporary clinical practice experiences for their future careers ▶50% theory, 50% practice
- Student remains employed in HCSW role
  - Must be substantive post
  - Must be minimum of 26 hrs per week






Figure 2 – Regulatory roles for the supervision and assessment of nursing and midwifery students


- Raise and respond to student conduct and competence concerns

#### Academic Assessor

- Gather evidence from other sources e.g., practice supervisor observations
- Communicate and collaborate with practice assessors
- Make / record objective, evidence-based assessments
  - conduct, proficiency, achievement.
- In partnership with the practice assessor, make recommendations

## **Entry requirements for BSc (Hons) Nursing**

Requirement	Demonstrated by:
Numeracy	Core skills in Numeracy at SCQF level 5  or Standard Grade Mathematics or Arithmetic (pass at credit level)  or N5 in Mathematics or Arithmetic or the equivalent
Literacy	Core skills in Communication at SCQF level 5  or Standard Grade English (pass at credit level)  or National 5 in English or the equivalent  Students who have achieved K101 or K102 will meet required literacy
IT Literacy	Computer skills
Meet OU requirements to enable declaration of health and character on registration with NMC	Satisfactory References, Occupational Health review and PVG

## **SCQF Level 5 Information: See <u>SCQF - SQA</u>**

- SCQF Level 5
  - Nat 5 (A-C)
  - Intermediate 2 (A-C)
  - Credit Standard Grade (Grade 1 or 2)
  - 'O' Grade A-C
- You will need to include a scanned copy or photograph of your original certificate with your application for the degree programme
- If unable to find this, check your qualifications by setting up an online account with MYSQA (1995 onwards)
- The Open University able to access your qualifications (pre-1995) contact

## **Qualification check: Lost/damaged certificates (Scotland)**

### Studied before 1995

- 1995
  - - Fee payable £40 (at 20.05.24)
    - 15 working day turnaround (usually)
    - SQA Certification Services
- Consider "Subject Access Request":
  - Personal information SQA (new)
- Complete Literacy and/or Numeracy at SCQF L5 or above (if necessary)

### Studied after 1995 (\*core skills from 1999)


- MySQA (next slide) not available pre Check MySQA for Literacy and Numeracy both must be at SCOF L5 or above
  - Order a replacement certificate\* : Core skills profile\* accepted check both components in each are at L5 (previous slide)
    - If you have both Q's at L5, order a replacement certificate\* (see pre-1995 information)
      - MySQA screenshot is not acceptable
    - If required, complete Literacy and/or Numeracy ASAP - SQA certificate issued when achieved (free)






## If you don't meet the Numeracy requirements

- ✓ Cost £110-£150, Part Time Fee Grant may apply (Earnings under £25K)
- ✓ Fixed or flexible start dates, must complete by OU application deadline

## **Credit migration of previous OU study**

Subject to successful application, students who complete:

- •K101 <u>or</u> K102 as a standalone module register in Oct 2025 and start the practice module (K104) in March 2026
- •K102 <u>and</u> K104 as part of the Certificate in Healthcare

  Practice can articulate directly into level 2
- •Students will be required to apply for credit transfer if previous learning has been delivered by another


