Phishing attempt

Please be aware of a recent phishing attempt experienced at another health board and which may start to target further health boards or public sector organisations.

This phishing attempt advises that 'NHS Scotland Compliance' are making important updates to their compensation and benefits in 2025, it contains health board branded logos, originates from "noreply@euotelesites.com" and contains a further email address of info@nhs.scot.

If you have received this email, please ensure you delete it or report it as phishing without accessing any links, if you have engaged with the links, please raise an urgent support ticket via the eHelp icon which can be found on your desktop or select the eHelp link within NHSGGC Favourites.

The email content references: 'changes will streamline salary adjustments, enhance performance bonuses, and improve benefits management for all employees. To review updated compensation details and benefits package'.

The recipient is then asked to copy a provided link to their browser and access the site.

Staff are reminded to be vigilant on receipt of any suspicious emails and not to click any unknown links or attachments from unknown sources.
