## **Chief Executive to retire after 41 years' service to NHS**

Our Chief Executive, Mrs Jane Grant, has announced her retirement.

Jane has held the role of Chief Executive for seven years and has worked for the NHS for more than 41 years. She joined the NHS in 1983 as a Management Services Officer within Highland Health Board and progressed through a variety of management posts in Lanarkshire and Glasgow before being appointed to her first Chief Executive role as Chief Executive of NHS Forth Valley in October 2013.



She returned to NHS Greater Glasgow and Clyde in 1 April 2017 as Chief Executive.

Announcing her retirement, Jane said: "I have decided to retire after 41 years' service to NHS Scotland. Within that time, I have been fortunate to work in five Health Boards across Scotland. I have had the privilege of working with many outstanding colleagues but I believe the time is right to hand over the reins to a new Chief Executive."

Dr Lesley Thomson KC, Chair, said: "Jane has been a tremendous Chief Executive, working tirelessly for patients and steering the organisation to deliver the

best possible healthcare for the local population. On a personal level, she has provided immense support to me in the months since I took up post and I am very grateful for her support. On behalf of the Board, I thank Jane for her service to NHS Greater Glasgow and Clyde.”

The Chief Executive will remain in post until the end of the year.
