I am delighted to announce a new resource to support our neurodivergent colleagues. Developed in partnership and informed by insights from the lived experiences of members of our Neurodiversity Staff Group, our Neurodivergence guide offers a wealth of information on common neurodivergent conditions, including dyslexia, ADHD, and autism. I encourage all staff to review the guidance here, which includes tips on creating a more inclusive work environment and complements our Reasonable Adjustment Guidance and Workplace Adjustment Passport.

The 22nd–28th of January marks Cervical Cancer Prevention Week. Each week, around six women are diagnosed with cervical cancer in Scotland. In line with the national screening programme, NHSGGC offers cervical screening to women and anyone with a cervix aged between 25 and 64. The test screens for the human papillomavirus (HPV) which is the main cause of cervical cancer and helps save up to 5,000 lives annually. My gratitude goes to the team providing this vital service to thousands of women every year. I urge all relevant staff to take advantage of this programme (even if they feel fine) by booking an appointment with their local GP when they receive their invitation.
