## UCI Cycling World Championships – travel update

As the city prepares for the [UCI Cycling World Championships](#), NHSGGC staff should be aware that changes to bus routes may affect how they to get to and home from work.

The event - which runs from Thursday, 3 August to Sunday 13 August - will mean the closure of some roads in Glasgow during some races.

As a result, public transport providers are amending timetables and services on certain days during the event.

Most local First Glasgow routes will use the M8 as a diversion while some Stagecoach services in the City Centre will be curtailed at Bridge Street subway station or the Broomielaw.
