### **Updated staff FAQs**

We have updated our staff frequently asked questions to include a number of areas, including new guidance on travelling abroad, shielding and self-isolating. Click here to see the updated FAQs.

#### Our Black, Asian and Minority Ethnic (BAME) Workforce

We previously acknowledged that there is emerging evidence that people from Black, Asian and Minority Ethnic backgrounds may be disproportionately affected by COVID-19. Further research and reviews are still underway and we await the results.

In the meantime, the health and wellbeing of our staff is a key priority and we are aware that many BAME staff may be feeling anxious and wish to discuss how best to protect themselves and their families at this difficult time.

Going forward, we have refreshed our Risk Assessment Form and managers will conduct a risk assessment with all BAME staff.

Aimed to be sensitive and supportive, these conversations will consider your psychological wellbeing and personal views/concerns about risk. If required we will provide support through our occupational health service. As part of the risk assessment all BAME staff with underlying health conditions and disabilities, who are over 70, or who are pregnant, will consider appropriate workplace adjustments. Depending on the outcome of the risk assessment, this could include placing staff in green rather than red zones, into non-patient facing roles, or asking staff to work for home, where this is possible.
