HCSW – registered Open University Pathway Applications Open

Are you a HCSW interested in becoming a Registered Nurse with Open University? Applications for 2025 intake are now opened and will close on **30th May 2025.**



To be eligible to apply, you must:

- Work 26+ hours a week in a permanent post;
- Have 12 years' experience in full time education (including all school years);
- Core communication skills at SCQF Level 5 or Standard Grade English (passed at credit level) or National 5 (or the equivalent) in English at the time of application;
- Core numeracy skills at SCQF Level 5 or Standard Grade Mathematics (passed at credit level) or National 5 (or the equivalent) in Mathematics or Arithmetic **at the time of application**;
- · Good character and good health; and
- Have your line manager's support.

Digital Skills and Literacy Programme – M365

What is M365?

M365 (Microsoft 365) is a group of applications to help you with work tasks and collaborate with colleagues. It includes Microsoft Word, PowerPoint, Outlook, Excel, and Teams.

How do I access M365 in NHS Greater Glasgow and Clyde (NHSGGC)?

All M365 applications are accessible from your NHSGGC Microsoft Edge browser.

Open Microsoft Edge, and with 'NHSGGC Staffnet' as your homepage, look for the 'App Launcher' at the top left-hand corner of the webpage. This looks like nine

dots Click on these dots and a pop-up screen will display the available applications.

Where can I find out more about M365 applications?

There are two sources of support:

1. NHSGGC M365 knowledgebase (local NHSGGC information)

2. NHS Scotland M365 Skills Hub (national NHS M365 information)
