Your patient is under the care of the Assisted Conception Service (ACS) at the Glasgow Royal Infirmary, as I am sure you are aware. The Infectious Diseases in Pregnancy Screening Programme no longer offers rubella IgG testing as part of the antenatal screening. This has been replaced with assessment of MMR immunisation history and postnatal immunisation, as required. As an ACS patient this can be performed prior to fertility treatment, offering protection for any subsequent pregnancy from measles and rubella. The ACS and the West of Scotland Specialist Virology Centre would be very grateful for your assistance.
